## GRADING

- Grades are based upon completion of assignments, assignment grades, review grades, test/quiz grades, projects, and participation/effort.
- A progress report will be sent at the mid-quarter.

## ASSIGNMENTS & AGENDA BOOKS

- Some in-class assignments are for practice and not usually given a letter grade.
- Neatness, correct spelling, and proper grammar are expected to the best of the student's ability in all subjects.
- Homework consists of finishing assignments, skill practice, reading, studying, and working on projects.
- Nightly homework is likely to take between 30-60 minutes.
- Student agenda are filled out by students and taken home daily. Teacher to check agendas daily.
- When a student is absent, they will receive an absent folder with assignments to complete and important handouts. They need to also check and copy the teacher's agenda into their agenda to record assignments.
- Students are responsible for taking home homework and items needed to complete the homework.
- All homework is due the next day unless otherwise stated. Homework is due by 8:00 am or it is considered late.
- Oops Slips are given for missing/late work. Late work will be given less credit unless a homework coupon is used.
- All work turned in on time is corrected and sent home in the Friday Folder at the end of each week.
