



2024 – 2025 Supply List

This is the basic list. While additional supplies may be needed once the year begins based on an individual child's class electives and class schedule, every attempt was made to provide as complete a list as possible. However, the supply list is a guide. Use your best judgment and consider your child's preferences while purchasing items.

For middle school students, we ask that each student has a full set of items at home as well as at school. Used supplies are acceptable/encouraged - **Do not purchase new supplies if you have USABLE used supplies from previous years** especially colored pencils, crayons, scissors, calculator, eraser, ruler, dictionary, glue, folders, expandable file, book bag, etc. While needed at times, these items are not used consistently enough to warrant the purchase of new items if you have usable items from previous years.

All grades: Items to have AT SCHOOL in your book bag/locker

(a second set is strongly recommended to have at home):

Used supplies are acceptable/encouraged.

Do not purchase new supplies if you have USABLE used supplies from previous years

(especially colored pencils, crayons, scissors, calculator, eraser, ruler, dictionary, glue, folders, expandable file, book bag, etc.).

ALL STUDENTS (ALL GRADES) – BASIC SUPPLIES:

1. #2 pencils (12 pack) and/or mechanical pencils (6 pack)
2. Large eraser (Stadedtler brand preferred)
3. Ball point pens: dark blue or black, red or green
4. Sharpie pens: one large and one fine tip black ink
5. Loose-leaf college ruled paper
6. Colored pencils (Crayola preferred)
7. Thin, colored markers (at least a set of 8)
8. Highlighters - Two different colors
9. Scissors
10. 12-inch metric ruler
11. Protractor
12. Glue stick
13. Scientific calculator - not a graphing calculator
14. Portable, manual pencil sharpener: the kind that collects shavings
15. Large box of tissue for Community Group classroom
16. Container of disinfecting wipes for Community Group classroom
17. 3x5 ruled white index cards
18. Two folders/pee chees that fit into binders
19. Five one-subject "spiral" notebook
20. Four 1" (or larger) binders (red, green, blue and black preferred)
21. Four sets of 8 subject dividers for binders (one set for four separate binders)
22. Graph paper notebook (recommend 80 sheets+)
23. ONE sturdy, supportive backpacks (no wheels unless a current medical ILP is in place)

Locker Information

NOTE: Do not purchase locker supplies at this time. Lockers will be assigned during orientation at the beginning of the school year.

Locker decorating rules will be distributed during orientation. No tape, magnets of any kind or other adhesives are permitted in or on the lockers.

Middle School Locker Size: 17 3/4 inches wide, 16 1/2 inches deep, 35 1/2 inches tall, and there are hooks on both sides of the locker that are 32 inches from bottom.

Emergency Kit Supplies

This kit will be kept in the students' Community Group classroom in case an emergency (such as an earthquake or severe ice storm) should occur that would detain the students at school for several hours.

Please put all supplies in a gallon-sized freezer bag with the student's first and last name written in bold permanent marker on the outside of the bag.

- Several healthy, non-perishable snacks – enough to last for 12 hours (fruit rolls, granola bar, jerky, dried fruit, crackers, etc.)
- Foil blanket or emergency sleeping bag
- Two freezer bags (quart size)
- A pocket sized tissue pack
- Small individual hand sanitizer
- Four hand warmers, or two larger instant heat therapy wrap, etc.
- Instant ice bag
- Permanent marker (any color)
- Small pad of paper (4" x 6" or smaller)
- Any medication for a pre-diagnosed life threatening condition (Bee sting/Epi-pen, Inhaler, etc.)
- Travel size contact lens solution if needed
- Lip balm
- Deck of playing cards or pocket sized game
- Instant glow/light stick or mini LED flashlight
- Disposable rain poncho (preferred) or large heavy-duty plastic garbage bag (approx. 33 gallon)
- Whistle
- Mini scissors (small size)
- Index card with emergency contact numbers, including an out of state contact – if available.
