



Suggested Supply List

This list reflects the essential supplies needed to start the year. While additional items may be requested based on your child's class electives or individual schedule, every effort was made to provide a complete guide. Please use your best judgment and take your child's preferences into account when purchasing.

For middle school students, we ask that each child has a full set of supplies both at school and at home. Used supplies are welcome—and encouraged—so please do not purchase new items if you already have usable ones from previous years. This is especially true for items such as colored pencils, crayons, scissors, calculators, erasers, rulers, dictionaries, glue, folders, expandable files, and book bags. These are used only occasionally and do not need to be replaced if your current items are in good condition.

Important Note: Used supplies are welcome and encouraged—please do not purchase new items if you have usable ones from previous years.

- This is especially true for: colored pencils, crayons, scissors, calculator, eraser, ruler, dictionary, glue, folders, expandable file, and book bag.
- Every effort has been made to make this list complete, but additional supplies may be requested based on your child's electives and schedule.

All Students – Basic supplies (Please have a set at school and at home)

Writing & Drawing Tools

- Ticonderoga 12ct Pencil Yellow #2 pencils and/or mechanical pencils (6 pack)
- Smudge-free large eraser
- Ballpoint pens
 - At least two dark blue or black
 - At least two red or green
- Sharpie pens: one large-tip and one fine-tip (black ink)
- Colored pencils, set of 12 (Crayola preferred)
- Thin colored markers (set of at least 8)
- Highlighters – two different colors

Paper & Organization

- Loose-leaf college-ruled paper (250+ sheets)
- Graph paper notebook (80+ sheets recommended)
- Two Pocket Plastic Folder
- Four: One Subject 100-page College Ruled Spiral Notebook
- Four 1" (or larger) binders – **preferred colors:** red, green, blue, black
- One two-inch binder (no color preference)
- Six sets of 8 subject dividers (one set per binder)
- One set of super sticky - sticky notes (Post-it brand preferred)
- One pack of 100ct 3" x 5" Ruled Index Cards
- Hard Sided Zipper Pencil Case (Strongly recommended)

Classroom Tools

- Scissors
- 12-inch metric ruler

- Protractor
- Glue stick
- Liquid glue (Elmer's preferred)
- Scientific calculator (not graphing)
- Portable manual pencil sharpener (with shavings container)

Community Group Contributions

- Large box of tissues
- Container of disinfecting wipes

Other Essentials

- One sturdy, supportive backpack (**no wheels** unless a current medical ILP is in place)
- Plenty of printer paper, a stapler, and staples to have at home

Locker Information & Decoration Guidelines

Locker Assignments: Lockers will be assigned during orientation at the start of the school year.

Locker Use

Your locker's primary purpose is to store your school supplies in a neat, organized manner so you can get to class on time.

Tips for Organization

- Consider using a "Stackable Sturdy Storage Crate Organizer Bins with Handles" as a shelf (Dimensions 17.25 x 14.25 x 10.62 inches) – inexpensive, sturdy, fits textbooks, and still leaves space for items like musical instruments.
- Avoid locker clips and magnetic cups for the door – they often don't stay in place due to door movement.
- Keep clutter to a minimum to save time and reduce stress between classes.

Decoration Rules

Students may decorate the inside of their locker only and must remove all decorations — including tape residue — by June.

Allowed:

- Painter's tape or masking tape to attach decorations
- Magnetic items **only** if they are part of a backing for a larger item (must not jam the lock)

Not Allowed:

- Scotch tape, double-sided tape, stickers, glue, or decorative magnets/small magnetic clips
- Inappropriate, disrespectful, or unsafe items
- Promotions or endorsements of drugs (including tobacco), alcohol, or messages contrary to Catholic teaching
- Photos or images of people not in modest clothing (must meet Free Dress guidelines)
- Decorations that insult or put down others

Safety Reminder:

Decorations must not pose any danger or injury to students or others. When in doubt, ask a teacher before adding an item.

Locker Dimensions

- **Width:** 17 ¾ inches
- **Depth:** 16 ½ inches
- **Height:** 35 ½ inches
- Two hooks (one on each side) located 32 inches from the bottom

Emergency Kit Supplies

Each student will keep an emergency kit in their Community Group classroom in case an event such as an earthquake, severe storm, or other emergency detains students at school for several hours.

Packaging Instructions

- Place all supplies in gallon-sized freezer bags as follows:
 - **Bag 1:** Any medication for a pre-diagnosed life-threatening condition (e.g., bee sting/Epi-pen, inhaler) – this bag will be kept in the front office.
 - **Bag 2:** All other supplies
- Each bag should be clearly labeled with the student's first and last name in bold permanent marker.
- Each student is limited to three bags total.

Required Items for Bag 2 – All Other Supplies

- Several healthy, non-perishable snacks – enough for 12 hours (e.g., fruit rolls, granola bars, jerky, dried fruit, crackers)
- Two foil blankets or one emergency sleeping bag
- Pocket-sized tissue pack
- Several small individual hand sanitizing wipes
- Four hand warmers OR two larger instant heat therapy wraps
- Instant ice bag
- Mini first aid kit
- A disposable mask (to protect from smoke or dust)
- Two sets of latex free disposable gloves
- Permanent marker (any color)
- Small pad of paper (4" × 6" or smaller)
- Travel-size contact lens solution (if needed)
- Lip balm, vaseline, or A&D ointment
- Deck of playing cards or pocket-sized game
- Instant glow stick/light sticks
- Disposable rain poncho (preferred) OR large heavy-duty plastic garbage bag (approx. 33-gallon)
- Whistle
- Mini scissors (small size)
- Index card with emergency contact numbers, including an out-of-state contact if available
