Missing School for Reasons Other than Illness

Students cannot miss 10 days of school in a semester and still be in compliance with school policy and the State of Oregon's attendance (#339.065) requirement (as outlined in our Handbook Section 2.11).

Once a student misses the 10th day for any reason, the student will not receive credit for coursework unless the student has a Medical Learning Plan due to a medically verified reason (surgery, chemo, COVID, etc.). The student's transcript will show that the student did not meet the minimum seat-hour requirement; thus, no credit or grade will be awarded.

Missing Final Exams and Standardized Testing Days

Final exams are a key part of our program, and we do not make accommodations unless there are extenuating circumstances (as defined in our handbook). Extenuating circumstances would include bereavement, surgery for the child, medical treatments (chemotherapy), concussion, in-treatment program (such as eating disorders or mental health, for example), etc.

If a student misses a final exam without an extenuating circumstance, the student will be marked absent and receive a grade of "0" on the final exam for any course that offers a final exam during final exam week. Some classes, though, have culminating projects instead of or in addition to finals.

If a student misses class during these projects or if she/he is involved with a group project that requires the student's presence in order for the group to complete their task, the student will not be granted a "make-up" assignment, as we do not offer individual accommodations without an Individual Learning Plan.

Program Preview

Valley Catholic Middle School's Outdoor Education initiative is designed to help students become confident, curious, and connected individuals. Grounded in our Catholic identity and school values, Outdoor Education at VCMS promotes personal growth, emotional wellness, and a deeper relationship with both nature and one another.

Mission Statement

Through Outdoor Education, students will become better communicators, more aware of their emotions and how to channel them constructively, and more deeply connected to both their community and the natural world.

Rooted in Our Catholic and Valiant Identity

The Outdoor Education Program reflects and reinforces the Pillars of Valley Catholic:

- Celebrating God, life, and creation
- Striving for excellence through balance and flow
- Honoring the unique gifts of each person
- Living valiantly by taking risks and embracing new experiences

Why Outdoor Education?

For the vast majority of human history, people have lived in close relationship with the natural world. In more recent centuries, that connection has diminished—often to the detriment of our emotional and physical well-being. Scholars like E.O. Wilson and Richard Louv have identified this disconnection as a contributing factor to Nature Deficit Disorder, with implications for human health and happiness.

At Valley Catholic, we believe that time spent in nature is not only healthy—it is holy. By offering meaningful, structured outdoor learning experiences, we invite our students to develop confidence, empathy, and stewardship for God's creation.

Key Goals of the Program

- Community Development: Strengthening belonging at VCMS
- Emotional Balance: Supporting emotional and spiritual growth
- Connection to Nature: Fostering awe, respect, and care for the environment
- Self-Reflection: Encouraging identity development and introspection
- Physical Activity: Promoting movement, exploration, and joy in outdoor spaces

More information about curricular connections and interdisciplinary activities will be shared later in the 2025–2026 school year.

Extended Day Field Trips – Save the Dates

A cornerstone of the Outdoor Education Program is our **Extended Day Field Trips**, one of which each grade level will experience during the 2025–2026 school year.

What Is an Extended Day Field Trip?

Each trip includes:

- Departure from VCMS at 7:30 a.m.
- Return to VCMS by approximately 7:30 p.m.

These full-day off-campus experiences provide students with a wide range of outdoor learning activities, shared meals, and time to gather around a campfire under the stars. Students build lasting memories and deeper connections with their classmates and teachers alike.

Asynchronous Days

To allow staff to accompany and support students on these trips:

- Students in the other two grades will have asynchronous learning days at home on the same date.
- Each student will have one Extended Day Field Trip and two asynchronous days throughout the year.
- Asynchronous assignments will be posted to Google Classroom and are expected to be completed independently.

This structure ensures full participation while also creating intentional space for staff and students to connect meaningfully during their time at camp.

Cost

There is no additional cost for the Extended Day Field Trip. All expenses are covered by the activities fee collected during registration.

Looking Ahead

Additional information—including specific dates, locations, what to bring, and family logistics—will be shared at **Back to School Night in September 2026**.

- April: Seventh Grade Outdoor Education (7:30 a.m. - 7:30 p.m.); Sixth- and eighth-grade asynchronous work at home.
- April Sixth Grade Outdoor Education (7:30 a.m. - 7:30 p.m.); Seventh and eighth grade asynchronous work at home.

We are thrilled to bring this renewed Outdoor Education Program to life for our students and look forward to a year filled with exploration, growth, and grace.
